



COLLECTOR'S EDITION(ED)

A sneak peek into the Art Gallery Association of Singapore's (AGAS) 2014 edition of its annual exhibition, Edition(ed). by LUYI CHEN

Art Galleries Association Singapore is set to present its second annual exhibition, Edition(ed) to be held at Artspace@Helutrans from 17 to 20 July. The event features 23 participating galleries with over 70 works ranging from photographs, prints and sculptures to digital works by more than 30 artists. The exhibition is a platform for member galleries to come together and demonstrate their cohesive nature and unity among galleries in Singapore. In addition, it continues the aim of AGAS to promote art appreciation in the community.

With a greater focus on editions and multiples, the exhibition is an opportunity for budding art collectors, art enthusiasts and students to discover the history and techniques of different mediums. The works exhibited will be for sale and prices range between \$300 and

\$83,000. Emi Eu, director of STPI and vice president of the association adds "Editions are great way to start a collection because it's usually much more accessible both in terms of price and availability. It also allows first time collectors to acquire original works of art by important artists whose prices are usually very high. The art of collecting editions continues to be relevant as it is a serious, accessible art form where one would be able to own the same work that is in a museum collection."

Edition(ed) will also feature a 'Saturday Matinee' programme held on 19 July from 2 to 5 pm which includes an exhibition walkthrough followed by a panel discussion on the history and currency of
